

RANK MINNESOTA NO. 1 U. S. TEAM IN WEEKLY POLL

Pitt Goes from Ninth to 2d; N. U. Is Third.

New York, Oct. 27.—(AP)—Without dissenting voice, Minnesota's Gopher have been nominated as the nation's No. 1 college football team in the weekly ranking poll conducted by the Associated Press.

Forty-four experts participated in the poll and agreed unanimously that the powerful Gophers deserved the top place on the list. They had been rated No. 1 last week, but their selection was not unanimous at that time.

Pitt Is Ranked Second.

Pitt's Panthers, routing Notre Dame, 26-0, in an amazing show of strength that rivaled Minnesota's 33-trouncing of Purdue, moved up from ninth place to second, although Northwestern's Wildcats and Washington's Huskies gave the Panther a tussle in the balloting. Duke, which had been ranked second a week ago, fell to 13th place as a result of its defeat by Tennessee. Notre Dame rated No. 7 last week, fell clear out of the rankings of the first twenty.

Marquette in First Ten.

In addition to Minnesota and Pitt Northwestern, Washington, Army and Southern California retain their places in the first ten. Fordham Louisiana State, Tulane, and Marquette moved into it, replacing Duke

Notre Dame, Purdue, and Yale.
