

# PITT STILL AT TOP IN FOOTBALL POLL

## Panthers, With 468 1/2 Points, Head 37 of 48 Ballots and Tie for First on One

### CALIFORNIA RANKS SECOND

### Fordham Third in Associated Press List—Notre Dame in First Ten as Yale Drops

Whether or not they go back to the Rose Bowl, the Pittsburgh Panthers are likely to wind up as 1937 national college champions in The Associated Press ranking poll.

They are likely to do so, that is, provided they disposed of Duke, their final opponent, at Durham, N. C., on Saturday. For Pittsburgh again ranks at the top in the weekly ratings made by sports experts all over the country.

Thirty-seven of the forty-eight ballots named Pitt as No. 1 team. Another split top ranking between the Panthers and Fordham, the team that held Pitt to a scoreless tie.

California's unbeaten and Rose Bowl-bound Bears continued in second place and Fordham in third position. Yale was displaced by Notre Dame in the first ten, while Minnesota, Dartmouth and Villanova moved up.

#### Minnesota Schedule Complete

Only California, Minnesota and Dartmouth of the first ten have completed their regular schedules.

For this week's games, the rankings indicate Pittsburgh has a pronounced edge over Duke, which, oddly, is tied for eighteenth with its conqueror, North Carolina. Alabama is the favorite over Vanderbilt, though the Commodores jumped six notches to twelfth place; Fordham is the choice over unranked New York University, Villanova over Loyola of Los Angeles, Santa Clara over Gonzaga and Louisiana State over Tulane.
