

SECOND PLACE GOES TO TEXAS CHRISTIAN

Horned Frogs Up Two Notches in Associated Press Poll of Football Writers

PITT REMAINS AT THE TOP

Named as Best Eleven in the Nation on 105 Ballots— Duke, Northwestern Gain

The Panthers of Pittsburgh again top The Associated Press poll of sports writers. Of the 115 who participated in the third poll, 105 picked the Panther eleven as the best football team in the land.

As a result, Dr. Jock Sutherland's apt and active pupils piled up 1,139 points, their highest total in the three weeks they have headed the game's first ten. They are 238 points ahead of Texas Christian, which romped over Baylor Saturday and climbed from fourth place to second in the rating.

The Horned Frogs got eight of the ten remaining first place votes. Tennessee and Holy Cross, neither of which threatened to enter the first five, got one each.

Newcomers to the first ten this week are Duke, which rode in on the heels of a two-touchdown walloping of North Carolina, and Northwestern, which toppled Minnesota Saturday on the football field and did it again in the ballot box. The Gophers were second a week ago. Now they are twelfth.
