Ohio State Retains First Place In Poll of 119 Football Writers

Six Other Teams Are Kept Among First Ten —Notre Dame, Victor Over Bierman's Eleven, Rises From 22d to 8th

One of the strangest sights in this topsy-turvy football season is a set of seven college gridiron greats remaining on top in The Associated Press poll two weeks in succession.

It happened yesterday when 119 sports writers from coast to coast again acclaimed Ohio State the outstanding collegiate eleven in the land and also supported the same half dozen standouts who trailed the Buckeyes for top honors in the season's first balloting a week ago.

Fifty-eight of the writers named the Buckeyes for first place and the others placed Ohio State high enough to give it a total of 1,030 points. This was 57 points more than were polled by the University of Georgia Bulldogs, who received 38 first place votes.

Two Change Places

The first seven schools in the list also were the first seven a week ago, although Alabama and Michigan traded ratings as the result of last Saturday's games. Both were victorious, but Alabama advanced to third place in the balloting with the help of an 8-0 triumph over Tennessee, while Michigan trounced Northwestern 34-16.

In some respects the scuffle for the other three places in select society proved of even greater interest.

Army and Texas Christian, both unbeaten, were squeezed out as Notre Dame beat Bernie Bierman's Iowa Pre-Flight, 28---0, and was ranked eighth; Santa Clara stopped Oregon State to take ninth place and Boston College nosed out the Navy's North Carolina Pre-Flights, 7---6, to land the tenth berth.

Notre Dame's feat was so highly rated that the Irish were lifted from twenty-second place a week ago to their present spot.
