GEORGIA TOPS POLL, WITH TECH SECOND

Boston College Third, Notre Dame Fourth in Ranking by Football Writers

ALABAMA IN FIFTH PLACE

Michigan, Texas and Tulsa Up From Second Ten—Seventh Spot for Wisconsin

Last Saturday's upsets apparently convinced the nation's sports writers that this year's capital of football is located in the State of Georgia.

The University of Georgia remains on top in the fifth week of The Associated Press poll, but this time Georgia Tech is only 100 points behind in second place.

That's a climb of one position for the veteran Bill Alexander's athletes, who a week ago were third, behind Georgia and Wisconsin. The Badgers, upset by Iowa, skidded to seventh.

Boston College continued its climb, taking third, with Notre Dame fourth. Alabama, in second place the first three weeks but eighth after its defeat by Georgia, climbed to the fifth rung.

Michigan, Texas and Tulsa

Michigan, Texas and Tulsa hopped out of the second ten to gain the sixth, eight and ninth places, while Ohio State, although it crushed Pittsburgh Saturday by 59 to 19, sank from sixth to tenth.

85 Place Georgia First

Georgia, which crushed Florida Saturday, 75 to 0, drew the first-place votes of eighty-five of the 112 experts, was second choice of twenty-two, and third of the remainder.

Georgia Tech was the popular choice for second place while Notre Dame and Boston College shared almost equally in the balloting for third and fourth, the Eagles going out front because of their ten votes for first place.

It was the fourth consecutive week in which B. C. has vaulted two notches and the Eagles are now directly behind the teams with whom they have been linked as probable opponents in the Sugar Bowl.

Dennis Myers now is at the helm at Boston College and he has welded a team that has scored 156 points in six games and permitted the opposition only 13. One of the rivals to score was the North Carolina Pre-Flight aggregation, which suffered its only defeat of the season, 7 to 6, at Boston.
