

# AP Poll Gives Lucky (?) Coaches Heebie-Jeebies

NEW YORK, Sept. 20 (AP).—  
 "Who? Me?"

That was the general incredulous, if not downright alarmed, reaction of college coaches whose teams were chosen in the top 10 in the Associated Press pre-season football poll.

The comments ranged from Michigan's Bennie Oosterbaan's "no comment" to a doleful "we'll be lucky to win half our games" from Tennessee's Bob Neyland, but all left the impression that the coaches felt they were being put on a very unwelcome spot.
