

# Trojans Enter First Ten in Football Poll

NEW YORK, Oct. 21. (AP)—Although they can't prove a thing, for the simple reason that the two teams don't face each other this season, many of the nation's sports writers expressed confidence today that Michigan would whip Notre Dame if the two should square off on a football field.

By an overwhelming majority, a cross section of the voting in the weekly pool of the Associated Press selected Fritz Crisler's mighty Wolverines as the top team in the land and assigned second place to the unbeaten Irish for the second straight time.

The only newcomer to the top 10 was Southern California, which moved from 11th to 10th place by virtue of its 38-6 rout of Oregon State, replacing Vanderbilt, knocked out of the unbeaten ranks by Kentucky.
