Bulldogs Supplant Ohio State as Nation's Leading Team -Wisconsin Is Second

GEORGIA TECH MOVES UP

Georgia's unbeaten and untied Bulldogs have advanced to recognition as the nation's outstanding college football force and there doesn't seem to be much their ri-vals for the honor can do about it in the near future.

Georgia's feat in toppling Ala-bama's powerhouse last Saturday brought the Bulldogs to the top of The Associated Press weekly poll of sports writers vesterday with of sports writers yesterday 84 5-6 first place votes and 1,189 1/2 points out of a total of 127 ballots

Easy Games Ahead

But out of the overhauling came an appearance of security for Georgia because the Bulldogs' schedule in the next three weeks calls for comparatively mild oppo-sition from Florida, Chattanooga and Auburn before their tradition-al season's finale with Georgia Tech, also unbeaten and ranked third in this week's voting. Wisconsin received 20 1-3 first-place votes and 1,051 points, based on ten for first, nine for second, eight for third, etc. The beating by the Badgers kept Ohio State from tallying a single first-place vote.
