80 OUT OF 82 VOTES GO TO CADETS IN POLL

It's Army again in the No. 1 spot in this week's Associated Press poll to determine the top football team in the nation.

The unbeaten and untied cadets, who are favored to wind up their second successive perfect season by beating Navy on Saturday, were voted first by eighty of the eighty-two sportswriters who balloted.

Tom Stephenson of the Elkhart, Ind., Truth, voted for Indiana, and Harold Harris of the Knoxville, Tenn., News Sentinel, named Alabama. Stephenson said "Army and Navy are in a class by themselves, somewhere between the colleges

and pros."

Altogether Army garnered 809 points to Navy's runner-up total of 684. Alabama, picked for the Rose Bowl, took over third place at 629 with Indiana, unbeaten but tied, fourth at 584. Notre Dame

placed fifth with 443.

The unbeaten and untied Oklahoma Aggies, named for the Sugar Bowl with St. Mary's, polled 358 points for sixth place. Michigan was seventh at 280, Pennsylvania eighth at 231, St. Mary's ninth at 221 and Texas tenth at 96.
